So, if you're not able to stay clean for 2 weeks, marriage won't keep you clean. did your wife get what se thaught she is getting...? Furthermore, after giving birth, your wife will usually be forbidden to you for 6 weeks (sometimes more). Therefore, if you're not able to stay clean for 6 weeks, marriage won't keep you clean. Also, keep in mind that if you're not actively in recovery, you won't have a clear head to decide if you're making the right choice who to marry. If she's beautiful, but not really right for you in more important areas, the good looks will likely be too much of a Shochad, unless you're working with the right priorities. This is not a question for just any rabbi (lives are at stake - your future wife and children), but should be discussed with a competent Posek. Aside from that, any rabbi who would allow someone who is actively addicted (i.e. not in recovery) to marry without disclosing his problem, seems to be viewing this matter as a moral failing, not as an addiction (no rabbi would permit someone to keep active alcoholism a secret). But, TY recognizes that he has an addiction, so the question does not begin.
