There is no easy way to uninstall K9, unless you have the password (if anyone knows how to do it, don't publicize your methods). Also, K9 allows you to whitelist certain sites.

Kedusha, there are several ways that anyone in her house could have uninstalled K9 without the password. Just off the top of my head I know of 2 such methods that take under 3 minutes time.

(In the same respect, if your router is physically accessible, it takes no more than a paperclip to

revert it back to the default factory settings. This, aside from automatically removing any whitelist you may have internally configured, your family members will also have access to reconfigure the settings by using the default password, and they can cover their tracks by setting up a new whitelist - only now with their own "exceptions".)

7Up, the only way that you can be certain that your settings are safe from your tech savvy son, is to sign up with a server-level filtering service. Why don't you pick up the phone to your internet service provider and see if they can manage a whitelist for you? If your ISP is setup for this (and most are), then they should be able to service you at no extra cost.
