I believe that is *far* more choviv to Hashem than if I fooled myself by trying to do it 'for the kedusha'. If you were really concerned at all about the principle of the thing instead of only resenting them for wronging you (which I agree they are), then I suggest that you'd feel at least a *little* sorry for these misguided women,...and you would daven hard for them.

Our prayers for other people, especially for our fellow Jews, is not just reserved for the *tzaddikim* among them. Hashem wants us to daven for the resho'im, and for the misguided - unless you really know that they are intentionally trying to ruin others and purposely cause others to sin to Hashem. Even those trying to tempt others to have sex with them are not in this category - they are just misguided idiots.

If we have no pity for the resho'im and for the misguided women out there, then we obviously do not really believe Hashem loves us and cares for us.
