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I was on the phone conference last night(I didn't check in), "gingerbread" led the call and was very articulate in bringing out the point I raised yesterday as for the need of a motivation to stop. he pointed out however that because this addiction is a progressive one - as I have seen on my own - it is crucial to realize that my life being manageable now could be temporary, what's if I get caught? or chas veshalem get into trouble? once im not in control everything is on the table.

another point. the reason you cant fight this addiction with you own will power as I have come to understand it is because the addiction is fueled by negative character traits based my self centeredness, in my case disappointments of not achieving status and recognition as I see fit, therefore basing recovery on my will power \ ego is in itself the problem.

third point. all the times that I was able to keep clean for many months at a time, it was without a fight, I just didn't have the urge to act out. after going through the big book I see that this situation is what is called sobriety based on a spiritual awakening. I felt the awakening so strong that I was disgusted by lust. I ask hashem to please help me reach such a stage.
