mikveh has nothing to do with recovery. it has to do with purity.

recovery comes with acceptance and humility and a lifetime of work.

and it can be detrimental for people who are not yet on this level to go dipping, thinking they are now done and pure and holy, when in an hour or two (or tomorrow) they will be right back at it again. fooling themselves into thinking the "holy water" will cleanse them from the devil within, which is really themself.

(agav, mkveh helps also for kedusha if you are holding by that, and if you are a woman or have eifer parah, it helps for actual tahara. never recovery)

in conclusion, mikveh may be the finishing touch, but it is not me'akev, it does not cleanse/erase the problem, nor is it the recovery.

the philosophy on GYE is to treat the cause of the problem... and aim for recovery.

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
