I said two main points- "We wouldn't become Christian to recover" and that we don't take or conception to G-d from SA- and you said "speak for yourself". I WAS saying it generally- that Jews can't take heir concept of G-d from SA and that we can't become Christian to recover. Rabbi Twerski and Taub never disagreed with that- they said SA is consistent with our theology- which it may or may not be. But neither of them ever said that one can take a conception of G-d if it is not consistent with Jewish theology. If you disagree with either of these, then recovery has supplanted Judaism and I don't think by any stretch that's what GYE is for. But I may have misunderstood what you meant. Please clarify if I did. And I specifically spoke up because if that is what you believe, it is at that point that I feel the need to at least clarify to the forum that while that may be your approach, it is a Jewishly unacceptable one and let others not follow.
