And why is man put in a situation where he will definitely sin, it's only a question of when and how??

His crazy, insane, obsessive, neurotic approach to Yiddishkeit together with his overloaded, constant ???? ???? have put me off every part of Yiddishkeit. I thought I had gotten over it but evidently I still have some sore wounds that need to heal.

Naturally I am very heavy on myself, very ambitious, try to achieve unrealistic goals and go on guilt trips on a daily basis.
