In my opinion, it all boils down to the "level of addiction" that you have. If you'd show this video to young teenagers who are starting to have this issue, it may make a strong impression on them to stop. However, once it has become an addiction, "Fear of Heaven" can't stop us anymore, and if anything, it makes it worse because it increases the guilt and anxieties, which cause us to act out even more. Please read Principle #10 of the <u>Attitude Handbook</u> called "Fear of Heaven can't stop us, but it can *PUSH* us".
