So, you are not perfect. Neither is anyone in this group, but neither is ANYONE ELSE.

Go before the Ribonno Shel 'Olam with an open honest heart, pour out your prayers, and serve the kehillah. If they did not want you/need you, they would not ask you. You do not know their sins, they do not know yours. Maybe, in some way that you cannot recognize, you are at a higher level than they, or you have something they admire or need. Think about it: you are here because you know you have a weakness, you admit you have it and you are working on it. That is very powerful.

Perhaps, also, this is a gift toward recovery that you can use in the following manner: After the Yomim Noraim, when you are tempted. ask yourself, "Is this the correct behavior for someone who lead the kehillah in Prayer?" Perhaps by having that to ask yourself, it will aid in your self-control.


