My wife & I are both long-time baalei t'shuva, but our "old" days had many movies, women's albums, magazines, and . So we feel sorta de-sensitized to some of the shmutz around us.

For many guys here, though, even a glance at a secular newsaper can set off a downward spiral. Is that because such pictures are such a shock to SO frum a person who never saw such shmutz before? Are guys from more "modern" families (or BT) able to weather the storm a little better since they've seen some of it before? Or is it simply a genetic pre-disposition toward se*ual compulsion/addiction?

So, please help: are the more-sheltered at more-risk?

This is a question I've asked myself before, but now that I havea child, I ask it as a parent.

A year ago, I thought it best to raise children in a way that's totally exposed to everything. How can one deal with the real world if you're not exposed to it?

Now that I can see how bad it is to fall into the trap of lust, I want to protect my child[ren] from it as much as possible. But this is the other extreme where suddenly when they're all grown up and emerge from thier cacoon, they get bombarded with something that overwhelms them.

I was once visiting a rabbi for Shabbos and his 11 year old daughter asked me all sorts of 'adult' questions.

I think the answer is in the Adam and Eve story. One needs the tree of life (Torah) first before one can start on the tree of knowledge (experience), because if you do it the other way round, you will be overwhelmed.

Our children need sufficient knowledge or they will find out from someone or something else, and the easiest place to get 'adult' information these days in from people who really do not care about your well being.

I must agree with Guard, the less exposure you have to it, the more sensitive you are.

I have less than half a year of total clean days since finding GYE and I can see that I am more sensitive than I was six months ago.

So, my answer to your question is yes, but my solution is to be better educated and thus prepared.

Sorry if I'm just thinking out loud here, that is a bit of a tangent.
