There is a story told about Rav Shach Ztz"l. There was a time that, due to medical issues, he wasn't able to delve into Torah with his usual *iyun*.

Nu? How can a fish survive without water? How can a Godol B'Torah like Rav Shach **survive** without learning Torah?

So Rav Shach chose the easiest & simplest part of the Torah to learn: On apples we make a *Borei pri ha'etz*, On carrots we make a *Borei pri Ho'adama*, On oranges we make a *Borei pri ha'etz*, On pears we make a *Borei pri ha'etz*, On bread we say *Hamotzi lechem min ha'aretz*, etc. These halochos don't take much brain power to review, but they <u>are</u> an considered part of the Torah! In its most basic level, this day has no significance outside the halachos of Maaser. Since the tithe must be taken from each year's produce separately, it is necessary to have a cut-off date as of when any newly sprouting fruit will be considered of the coming year's crop.

Chazal teach us that this day was chosen because on this day the sap begins to flow and this is the first beginnings of the new growth season. Although there is no noticeable difference on the tree or its limbs, the fact that deep down in the subterrainan roots there is new growth, albight in a very small amount, it is sufficient to herald the new beginnings!

The lesson is clear. Our goal here in the great GuardYourEyes Community is rebirth. **BUT**, even if, at times, we do not see any REAL change, we feel like we are back at our starting point, we should remember the lesson from the trees. An outside onlooker might not see the transformation, but WE know that internally we have the started afresh.
