The fundamental principle of throwing the "fight" to Hashem, that is one of the fundamentals of this site and the 3rd of the 12 steps? is an open gemorah in Rosh Hashana..

The pasuk says in Tehilim "throw onto Hashem your "yhovchuh" and He will sustain you"

The geomorah says the Rabonan didn't know what the meaning of the word "yhovchuh" was until an arab porter said to one the rabbis "take your 'yhovchuh' and throw it in my camel"

The question is how can it be that the holy sages didn't know the meaning of a simple word in Tehilim and an arab porter did know?

Secondly, what meaning did the arab add to the word when he said "throw your baggage onto my camel"

Answers the Gaon of Vilna: the sages didn't understand how much license we can take to throw our burdens on Hashem. How much do we have to do on our own? When the arab on his own volition asked the rabbi to place his "yhovchuh" which in Hebrew means "what you have to give" on the camel, the rabbi understood that even the minor hishtadlus of saying requesting the service of the porter, he didn't have to do, rather the porter ask him can I take your burdens.

Lesson; the Almighty says the same to each one of us "may I take your baggage Sir/Madam?

All that is left for us to do is.....to let Him Hashem take it !!!!!

Behind this question rests the secret of eicha, tisha b'av and all the suffering of the yidden in this long exile. I cannot recall wih calrity which sefer deals with question directly, but I will share a few insights which I believe is the backbone to the answer.

I will quote a few important sources that I think can help us gain proper insight:

English(based on rashi): I only love you(the Jewish nation), and that is why I remember all your sins and pay retribution for all your sins.

Meaning, through our affliction, we can understand that Hashem loves us so much.

2)<u>Ramban Shaar Gemul:</u> The reason why the Jewish nation suffers so greatly (more than any other nation) is due to their greatness. On a personal level, Hashem pays retribution to the tzaddikim for every minute sin so that the tzaddik will get an increased olam habah. So, too, on a national level. The Jewish nation, being the fact that they are Holy tzaddikim, deserve punishment in this world in order to increase their reward in the next.

English: No one desires tzion. If you look at the pesukim in context you will realize this is one of the scariest pesukim. The goyim say that they can conquer yeushalyim because the Jewish nation have given up hope on yerushalyim, C"V. The Gemara(succa 41a) comments that we see from here that we must seek, desire and yearn for yerushalyim. That is why Chazal instituted the lulav outside of the beis hamikdash (on all seven days); to 'remember' the beis hamikdash. But not just a remembrance- rather as a way to express our yearn and hope for te rebuilding. For without that, oy gevalt.

4) <u>Chsam Sofer (drashos)</u>: There is nothing more dangerous than giving up hope. If the Jewish nation would give up hope, they and the beis hamikdash would be gone. What keeps us going as a nation and what give strength to the beis hamikdash is the fact that we do not give up

hope. On Tisha B'av we reaffirm our hope by mourning. By showing how much we yearn for it, we are keeping it and the Jewish nation alive. And the fact that we continue to mourn is a sign that we have not given hope and a sign that we will endure.

There is more to quote. But you will need to join me on tisha b'av for greater elaboration. I am just giving a small glimpse.

Tisha b'av is not a day of despair, but rather a day of hope. It is not a day of saddness as much as a day of reflection of who we are as a nation. It is a day of realizing the deep connection that Hashem wants with us but cannot express it because of our behavior. But through all the affliction, we realize how much he loves us. It is a day to understand what we are lacking and what we can attain. It is a day of expressing our true bitachon in Hashem. There is no other day on the Jewish calendar that emphasizes bitachon as much tisha b'av.

The book of Eicha is the same. Through all the sorrow, comes joy. A different kind of joy. The Orchos Hatzaddkim explains how true simcha is having complete bitachon. The medresh tells us that the lessons of bitachon can be found in the third perek of eicha. Every year I read this chapter with great intensity and hope. One sees how through Yirmiyahu's sorrow became true unbroken bitachon. One sees how he struggled with the deepest question of the world and came to realize the truth of the world. He recognized the hand of G-d in all his life.

I think it was the bein Ish Chai (never read it) who wrote a commentary on eicha Explaining how each pasuk can be interpreted for good. He explains that in future times, we will still retain the book of eicha and it will have a different meaning than the one we are familiar with at present.

Yirmiyahu was a man of truth and unbroken bitachon. His tears were real. His tears were not tears of a child crying over a broken toy. His tears expressed his deep and correct understanding of the universe and the Jewish nation. The reason why the seforim tell us that sadness is a sin, is because usually it is an expression of lack of bitachon. Most people lose focus on life when they get sad. They can become depressed. They lose all motivation for torah/mitzvos. It is an expression of selfishness. Sadness over gashmiyus is wrong. But sadness over ruchniyus is a joyful expression. When a person mourns the loss of ruchniyus, he displays his appreciation for the value. This is proper. This does not lead to a depressed state. It leads to a hopefull state. If you read eicha carefully you wil see how much hope there is. You will read about the optimism through the dark world.
