When i was in active addiction(meaning i was regularly m(&^*&*##G), i would often feel much closer to HASHEM during davening shortly, though not immediately, after a fall. "i'm so sorry to have done this terrible thing, but i know YOU love me. Please, please please don't push me away, i want to be close to YOU and i want to stop doing this sort of thing, etc..." Looking back(hindsight is 20/20), i think it was a ploy of the yh.

Fast forward, Erev Shabbos Parshas Pinchas. Over 250 days sober, one day at a time and i was davening mincha. i felt so close to HASHEM and contrasted it to the feelings of closeness of the past and realized how empty that past closeness really was. That was a closeness of separation and despair and this was a closeness of love and nearness.

another point:

looking ahead to Yom Kippur and i feel that i can't ask my wife for some blanket forgiveness for the wrongs i have done her as i have in the past. i have just e-mailed our Rav(he knows of my addiction) to ask him if he will meet with us so i can tell my wife about my addiction. i will, bli neder, keep you posted.

Until i accepted my addiction, i always viewed acting out as a religious problem. i was raised non-observant and "carpe diem" was how i lived. After my journey to yiddishkeit began, i realized mz'l was assur so i attacked it from the religious angle - Torah tavlin. When that didn't work, i spoke to a rebbe. He gave me the best advice he knew- get married. i did and guess what, the addiction was still there. i had the opportunity to speak with a Gadol about my problem and he told me to get rid of the internet - but lust is my problem not the internet, so that didn't help. After several more years i told my Rav "i have an internet problem" code for mz'l. He told me "It is good for you to get this out into the open. You probably won't be able to stop. Let's talk some more in a few weeks" - no help there either, but... Last Simchas Torah, the Rav announced that some of the kibuddim would not be auctioned for money this year but for inspiring pledges in Torah and yiddishkeit. It touched me, but i couldn't make my pledge in front of the kehilla, so during the dancing i told him that i was pledging to "shmiras einayim as he defined it not as i define it" code for i want to stop being mz'l. He smiled and said "That is the most inspiring pledge I have heard all night. Let's talk after Yom Tov." But there was no talk after Yom Tov for many weeks. During this time i fell one or more times(after the first thousand or so you begin to lose track) and then stumbled, or was i pushed, upon GYE. From the first moment i knew things were about to change. i signed up for the 90 day chart and haven't looked back. By the time i finally met with my Rav, i was close to a month clean and he suggested i go to SA meetings. That took some time on my part, but it has added to my sobriety immeasurably. i meet regularly with my Rav and keep him in the sobriety loop.

Update- my Rav wants to meet with me again before/if my wife is brought into the loop. He isn't certain if any good will come from the disclosure. Will keep you updated.
