dear thump, by 'die', i mean the withdrawal from any drug, including ours, feels like dying, because it's been our life for so many years.i obviously dont mean dying literally, you're right.the withdrawal, depending on how strong the addiction, can be torture - it mamash feels like you're going to die.in order to be truly happy, we have to let go of that fear, and 'kill' ourselves, like the Torah says.it doesn't mean to commit physical suicide, it means to get rid of those things that keep us from having true happiness, but make us FEEL as if those things bring us true happiness - which they don't - they only bring us 'death', so to speak.

i'm still working on these things myself - it's only been 3 years coming off a 38 year habit (addiction).
