- 4) Join the <u>90 Day Challenge</u>. Scientific studies have shown that it takes 90 days to change the neuron pathways created by addictive behaviors in the brain.
- 5) Post away on this forum, where hundreds of yidden like you exchange chizuk and post logs of their journey to recovery. You will internalize that you are not alone, and you will learn the techniques and attitude that work for so many others.
- 6) Join our free anonymous **phone conferences**, led by an experienced sponsor.

I have a balckberry and had to look into this as well.

There is software called PhoneSheriff - www.phonesheriff.com that blocks specific websites and phone numbers on blackberry, but not latest version (as of a few months ago). My BB is about 2 years old so that was fine for my phone. I'm pretty sure that it doesn't filter out entire categories, but let's you enter specific website and phone numbers that will remain blocked. It uses a simple 5 digit password - so I had someone just enter a password for me that I do not know. no need for me ever to see those websites again or call those numbers.

So if you can select some specific sites and number to block - this might be a good alternative.

A possible better solution is to ask your service provider - i.e. T-Mobile, Verizon - and i think they can usually block porn and adult websites from their end. My BB is work supplied, and thus controlled by admin at my work - I choose not to get them involved.

Hope that helps. Great to block out the shmutz!
