Furthermore, almost *anyone* is reading this! *Good* people like us who are sincere can be on GYE - and also *bad* people who *are* looking to destroy reputations, R"I, can be members here and reading the forum, of course. Hiding behind a fake name ('username') is indeed a double-edged sword! Yes, the fakeness of it all does make the sharing *feel* safer, so that more people will open up here (of course, they are not yet opening up to anybody *real* that way, but that's another juicy discussion entirely) -- but then it also protects whoever is *reading* the posts. If they are bad people and trying to figure things out from little details we let slip, then they could possibly make trouble. This is no chidush.

And the *really* ironic part is this:

While *our posts on the forum* obviously can fall into the hands of a few unsafe and insincere people - *meeting* another sicko like me on the phone or in person is actually the *safest* way to share personal, incriminating facts about ourselves. For it is with another real live *recovering* person! Who is safer than another person like me who is recovering and admits all the truth about themselves to other safe recovering people? No one.

We are surely the very *worst* keepers of our secrets.

When we entrust *ourselves* with them, we always eventually act on them....but when we let them go and share them honestly with safe people, we let them go and do not need to act on them.

The forum is surely not the place to write any vivid sexual descriptions of our behaviors or issues. And this is no stirah with anything I wrote earlier about the terrible idea of sterilized 'lashon nekiyah' here.
