so my wife became a niddah this week and it's caused somewhat of a setback in our relationship. #1- physical touch is very important to her and helps her feel close to me; #2- she doesn't feel motivated to go through all the halachic hoops and jumps in order for us to be together, mainly because (a) it's usually very difficult for her anyway: it feels demeaning to her and as she's a little bit of a feminist she finds it oppressive and takes it personally to mean that there is something wrong with her; and although usually: before all this happened I could talk her through it and encourage her; (b) since the incident: she doesn't feel like she wants to go through all of this for a husband who isn't exactly the man of her dreams at the moment after all he's done to hurt her (me)
