I've been around the site a little bit. I've been getting the chizuk emails for awhile now and have learnt alot from them. I actually discovered it awhile back but was doing pretty well just following the Breslev approach to life of Rabbi Arush and Rabbi Brody to strengthen one's Emuna in order to succeed in life. I truly believe that following their advice of an hour of hitbodedut a day can help cure even this@!

So why am I here? Because I've been failing at doing the hour of hitbodedut. and so I've been getting into cycles of 1 week clean, then 1-2 days of lots of shmutz and acting out. Lately, i've noticed the big emotion I'm feeling right before acting out is lonliness and disconnected. Too much time spent during the day by myself. Hashem gave me lots of free time to learn but I just can't seem to always sit and do so. Nor can I find someone to learn with. and as much as the Garden of Peace has helped my relationship with my wife, I still feel disconnected from her and others. After yesterday's acting out, Feeling so badly about it finally gave me the push to do hitbodedut for an hour committed to it, in a park walking by myself, the prescribed method. In the past, I would just talk to Hashem when it was convenient, like during my commute to and from work.

So I currently rate myself at level 4. I've decided to download the K9 filter as soon as I can get my wife to do the password/email part; no reason not to have a good fence. Will look into a filter for my phone as well. I read up about the Taphsic method. Its really intriguing and i'm interested in trying but I'm concerned about what distractions would work for me in the double condition method. I dont think the tzedaka or learning options would work for me. It'd be nice to connect better with someone. sometimes I feel as if im fighting not just this fight but the emunah fight by myself. I intellectually know Hashem is here with me but its hard not having even one good friend who I know really believes in this stuff and wants to work on it too. So this makes me finally see the necessity of the groups, the phone conferences, the chizuk calls. Its the connecting to others.

OK, im sure right after I submit this, I'll think of 20 other things to type but for now, that it. HI EVERYONE! oh, and its Metal King, not Me talking. Used to be a big fan of metal music.

Gotta get outta my head so here comes a little mental diarrhea. (Sorry for the imagery)

Last couple of weeks or so have really been a roller coaster. Ill have days that are smoother than smooth. Getting along with wife, children behaving or even when theyre not, He keeps me patient and anger at bay. Surrendering my negative emotions to Him makes them melt away. Life is grand.

Then a day later, nothing seems to be going right. I cant seem to open my mouth in personal prayer even when I beg Him for help. Start feeling overwhelmed by even accidental first glances on the street. Taking off my glasses feels so uncomfortable its practically gehennom. Snap or yell at kids. Lust starts to enter. Lsut even after wife.

And then a day later, smooth again.

Are my expectations so out of line of reality? I know life is not 100% Gan Eden even for those in recovery, but this seems way too choppy. Which makes me want to analyze where I went wrong. Did I not surrender enough? Am I being dishonest with myself somewhere? Is the Ribono Shel olam trying to get me to take on some new step or task?

Today is my birthday and He played a nice joke on me. My wife announces: "Honey, bad news: I'm a niddah." Yes, I can admit. I was hoping, nay expecting birthday sex. and now, I have to fight, check that, try and surrender the resentment I feel...to Him, for saying NOT TONIGHT, buddy! resentment to her for the way she relayed the information. The majority of the time, she's barely into sex but she gives me the bad news as if its a big disappointment to her also....Yeah riiiight. Now you wont have to hurry me to finish already or complain about the whole messy cleanup to me.

I'm sorry, I know that part of my addiction is wanting others to lust after me, including my wife but is it so terrible that I EXPECT or HOPE that one day my wife would actually physically desire to be with me because she actually enjoys sex with me? Because right now, I just dont buy it. And this leads to much unhappiness and part of the desire to act out: Why do I want to be with my real life wife who has no interest in being there when I could just masturbate and stare into the eyes of the porn star on the screen? its easier to pretend she's actually into me!

I definitely feel dry-drunk sober at the moment. Why is it that the only time I feel a reprieve from the pressure of life and falling off into the abyss is either when I'm adding personal prayer into my shemona esrai or when I'm at the one and only SA meeting per week that I can attend?

Why are there these days when no matter how many times I say it to Him, I cant seem to give up the resentments, the anger, the worry, the stress,? I admit my powerlessness to them. I feel like I'm working the first 3 steps and yet I get nowhere.

And then another day, I do the exeact same thing and everything works!! what the heck is going on?

I would love a vacation but I think I'd be happy even with smoother sailing.

person. My wife doesn't, shouldn't, and couldn't know every thought of mine. I feel loved by my sisters but they certainly don't know everything. My mother passed away along time ago and my father has his own mess.

The SA meetings help to know others are like me and don't condemn me for my thoughts or actions, and can even relate and empathize. But still, i don't get a real vibe that any of them really give two cents about me outside of that hour either.

If I've found maybe one friend so far outta this, its BigMoish but anonymous online has its limitations.

This is where I'm starting to see the value of finding a sponsor to work the middle steps comes in. To make a real life connection, with someone else, who hears every dirty terrible secret, accepts me for who i am, wants to speak to me when i check in, cares about my success or not. What chizuk that would bring.

Hmmm, maybe then i can start to believe the same about G-d.

I think I'll start davening to Hashem to find me a sponsor. (if i have to ask, then i feel like a pity case)

Bh, Shabbat was two months sober! I continue to see each day that without His help i would fall in no time. I simply cannot cope with life's challenges by myself. Physical pain, like an ingrown toenail or pulled muscle, I'm a big baby. If i didn't pray to Him and stay connected, I'd easily end up turning to lust for a fix.

If i don't ask Him for help being a father, strength in patience and holding back anger and being kind, my kids will drive me nuts and I'll up snapping and yelling at them and making them cry. Which in turn makes me feel awful.

If i don't ask for help to be a good husband and help to internalize The Garden of Peace principles, i get pissed off at my wife and full of resentment.

The only thing keeping me sane and a mensch day to day is consistent prayer to Him.

In fact, as a rule, I'll say: every day of these two months where i squeezed out close to an hour of total personal praying, the day was wonderful; how life seems to be described in recovery.

And every day i failed to pray properly and enough, i felt closer to a dry drunk, the worst days barely white knuckling it to sleep.

Sounds simple but personal prayer for an hour is super tough. That's where maasim tovim really seem to help. Paying shiva calls, visiting the sick (need to do more), going to SA meetings, etc all help me see the blessings in my life and shift my view of reality to good making it much easier to thank Him and ask Him for help with being a better person in return. And that cycle just seems to build on itself.

Thank you Hashem, thank you GYE, thank you Garden books and SA books, thank you friends and fellow addicts who connect with me. Couldn't have done it without your help.

Please Ribono She Olam, please bless me and all the addicts out there in the world, those diagnosed and those sadly unaware to come closer to you and make teshuva, thru SA, GYE, thru the 12 steps, thru Breslev, thru all other avenues You see fit, Amen.
