My name is iLoveHashem247. I am a married man with a supportive wife and three wonderful kids. Looking at my life from an outsider's perspective, you'd think I have it all. I own a renovated home on my own private road with lots of land, run my own business with which i support myself, am fortunate to be able to learn many more hours a week than i work, and am a popular and recognized member of my community - and I'm not yet 30 years old. But all this comes with a price tag - a lifelong struggle with addiction, mostly with marijuana and risky sexual encounters.

I had girlfriends in high school before becoming BT, and had shmirat habrit challenges, like most teens. I struggled with SB and engaging in sexual activities at massage parlors but was able to be clean for at least 6 months before marriage. during my wife's pregnancy with our second child, i unfortunately reverted back to my pre-BT habbit of recreational marijuana during the stress of a second pregnancy (the first one outside of the shana rishona "infatuation zone"), which in turn let down a rabbit hole of other issues... i had recently been visiting massage parlors, not for the sexual experience (i do not engage in any "happy endings" anymore, rather when i do succumb it is for the exhibitionism that i can indulge in without making a massive chillul Hashem). I am also very disappointed to admit that i had a sexual encounter with a shiksa who picked up a business card i had left at a restaurant i ate in, she sent me lewd photos and we met up one time (sept 12, '22) where she performed oral sex on me.

I am struggling to break out of these addictive patterns - i have recently filtered my home office desktop, my work laptop, and my smartphone i use to run my business (main issue was watching movies and free "live cams"). The crazy thing is tha tl am a person who has made such amazing changes in my life - in many ways, I am the kind of person i look up to and always wanted to become - but it is the sticky residue of my past life that I'm having such a hard time getting rid of.

I am sick of who I've secretly become and the double life i am living.

I want to be fair to myself, honest and equitable with my wife, and and terrified of the shame i will face when standing before my Creator on my day of judgement.

Well, that was deeply revealing and I have revealed to you, fellow strangers, that which i have not even revealed to my wife. To be fair though, i have been fully open with her regarding the guarding of eyes and marijuana addictions, but have never ever discussed the massage parlor or infidelity.

It's late at night and about an hour and a half past my bedtime so I will keep it short. I have been waking up very early every morning, biking to shul. Feeling better - my teeth tingle after I exercise so hard; and I can start my day on a high without doing any drugs.

I finally cut off that crazy toxic person from my life and all the people involved with him. I actually saw him tonight at an event and did not even engage with him or his cronies. Moving on!

I was struggling with my business (still having major cash flow problems), and spoke to my Rabbi and asked him for advice. Interestingly enough, he has a lot of experience in the same business due to his family being involved. Gave me a lot of great pointers, and today I made some major moves, which should turn the business towards an excellent direction. When we have struggles in life can be very very difficult, but it is surely what takes us to the next level, and separates us from those who are cruising in categorizes us, and to those who

are actually driving

I spoke to HHM, when I was almost at the end of the rope, and he told me I am not the only one with financial problems and burdens, and I have to just let go and let God run the show. So I had a conference with my creator and I told him I can't do this at all so it's gonna have to be on you and then everything started to turn around. I am also very grateful that my rich dad did not just say yes when I asked him for money and categorically refused to give me Asian dollar more than what I was getting with my part-time job for him he committed very positively to giving me any machines, tools, education that I would need in order to thrive, but not money , he is very smart because that is the reason that I started taking things much more seriously and hustling my butt off

I know that my efforts do not have anything to do with the results, but I underestimated how much effort I am required to put in, and use my learning as an excuse for running away from making the proper effort

This is one of the most depressed people I've ever met in my life.

This is such a beautiful post on so many levels.

I'm also getting to love the world in a blurry filter...

Even on my own block on Shabbos afternoon, the glasses come off and I'm in a state of bliss. Some women prance around all afternoon all dressed up and in long fancy sheitels etc in 90 degrees Fahrenheit, while my wife....

So instead of getting myself aggravated and full of lust and resentment like I used to, I just don't see anything, and skip along my merry way!

I am actively working my mindset to cherish my current financial struggles and the closeness to Hashem it is bringing me.

I grew up with lots of money and can say from experience that wealth is a greater challenge to avodat Hashem because there is no feeling of desperation which leads to having to lean on Hashem. It is also problematic to grow up in such a way because there is no development of resilience to adversity. If there's a problem, you just throw money at it and it usually goes away. And it doesn't even hurt, because it's not your money - it's your parents money.
