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Hello, Friends.

My name is iLoveHashem247. I am a married man with a supportive wife and three wonderful kids. Looking at my life from an outsider's perspective, you'd think I have it all. I own a renovated home on my own private road with lots of land, run my own business with which i support myself, am fortunate to be able to learn many more hours a week than i work, and am a popular and recognized member of my community - and I'm not yet 30 years old. But all this comes with a price tag - a lifelong struggle with addiction, mostly with marijuana and risky sexual encounters.

I had girlfriends in high school before becoming BT, and had shmirat habrit challenges, like most teens. I struggled with SB and engaging in sexual activities at massage parlors but was able to be clean for at least 6 months before marriage. during my wife's pregnancy with our second child, i unfortunately reverted back to my pre-BT habbit of recreational marijuana during the stress of a second pregnancy (the first one outside of the shana rishona "infatuation zone"), which in turn let down a rabbit hole of other issues... i had recently been visiting massage parlors, not for the sexual experience (i do not engage in any "happy endings" anymore, rather when i do succumb it is for the exhibitionism that i can indulge in without making a massive chillul Hashem). I am also very disappointed to admit that i had a sexual encounter with a shiksa who picked up a business card i had left at a restaurant i ate in, she sent me lewd photos and we met up one time (sept 12, '22) where she performed oral sex on me.

I am struggling to break out of these addictive patterns - i have recently filtered my home office desktop, my work laptop, and my smartphone i use to run my business (main issue was watching movies and free "live cams"). The crazy thing is that I am a person who has made such amazing changes in my life - in many ways, I am the kind of person i look up to and always wanted to become - but it is the sticky residue of my past life that I'm having such a hard time getting rid of.

I am sick of who I've secretly become and the double life i am living.

I want to be fair to myself, honest and equitable with my wife, and and terrified of the shame i will face when standing before my Creator on my day of judgement.

Well, that was deeply revealing and I have revealed to you, fellow strangers, that which i have not even revealed to my wife. To be fair though, i have been fully open with her regarding the guarding of eyes and marijuana addictions, but have never ever discussed the massage parlor or infidelity.

went to an SA meeting this morning where there were two frum women - one of whom shared that she was 1.5 years sober but struggling /obsessing/fantasizing about rekindling an old relationship with a woman from her past. took a lot of guys to say that in a room full of male "sexaholics." especially as a frum woman (i think maybe chasidish even), to be talking about SSA... really humanized her in my eyes and helped me see her as a person and not an object.

dealing with cleaning up some of the wreckage of my past, although it is expensive and annoying, i am glad to be putting these things behind me.

Have been doing a lot of self-work and journaling with "the river guide" which is an iintroduction-to-SA questionnaire.

Raising a lot of awareness of things i struggle with, for example: I am a person who tries very hard to succeed at things I set my mind to (building a business, fixing my stove, getting sober, etc) and I am not scared to pursure all avenues until i reach my goals. but at a certain point, there is a limit to hishtadlut, and there is no more to do that will be effective or rational. for example a package i shipped went missing and i tried really hard to recover it - going as far as visiting the address to which it was mis-delivered to (USPS sucks) and knocking on apartment doors on the far shot change that maybe i will find my package (i didn't recover it). at the point at which i feel it is appropriate to give up, i can usually accept Hashem's will, for example with the missing package, even though it was an expensive item that got lost, it was not that hard for me to accept this as G-d's will. I did all i could, and i guess Hashem decided that i should not find it right now, maybe not ever.

But when it comes to sobriety, i know He wants me to succeed. I try so hard, and i have been trying for over a decade (most of which i was not even aware of SA), and i have not been able to get sober by myself. My subconscious attitude has been "if I can't fix it, then how in the world can He fix it?"

it is so hard for me to let go of the concept that I can more than G-d can.

I'd deleted the number a while back and I guess that also unblocked the number, so I answered with "hi, who is this?"

The response was "this is \*\*\*\*\*\*, how are you?"

I exhaled a breath of disbelief, and **hung up**. Would've been superbly satisfying with a flip phone. Alas, my dump phone is of the non-flip variety.

(How do you think I am, buddy? Alive and well, no thanks to YOU!)

I spoke to my sponsor and some old timers, consensus was to treat him as an unwanted solicitor if he calls again - "sorry, not interested in what you're selling, please respect my privacy and don't call me again."

What a terrible experience! First, I hope you have re-blocked the number, but if he does find a way to contact you, I would not give him the satisfaction of hearing your voice other than you

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saying "hello." I would hang up immediately. You do not need to listen to a single word this person has to say. He is not entitled to hear your voice. It must be triggering.

The odds of a true manipulating narcissist calling to apologize is probably even less than that;)

They will always seek to project the blame onto **you**, the victim. So, it may *sound* like an apology while it really isn't. Because "**you**" misunderstood/took it out of context etc.

They are incapable of genuinely experiencing empathy for the hurt they caused. Obviously, he caught you off-guard, being on the toilet and all. But if I was in a good, calm headspace, and could say stuff without getting emotional, I would relish the opportunity to ask that narcissistic cult leader some tough questions. Tough questions, that you would never *dare* ask while you were still in the group. Questions like: You presented yourself as the ultimate loving, caring person. Does a loving caring person act like "x"? Do you really believe that you have the Divine authority to advise "x"? Do you not realize how abusive you behaviour is to other human beings? Do you not realize that you are nothing more than a manipulator? While you claim to be so righteous and holy, you sleep very well at night despite the trail of broken hearts of many former people who have crossed your path...does this ever bother you? Are you not concerned for a day of reckoning in the World to come? Of course, none of this actually will help the true narcissist. He will not take even ONE moment to reflect on your words. He will immediately rationalize that you are the crazy one while he was totally justified. But I sometimes imagine that this conversation would afford some measure of closure, and could be very healing.
