Hello Pomegranate,

I am much younger than you and cannot come close to identifing with your excruciating pain and guilt, but I struggle with fears and thoughts about what could chas vshalom happen based off what the Kitzur Shulchan Aruch and other sefarim say.

Please please please keep in mind the folowing 3 points:

1) The world has changed in terms of morality and exposure far more between when the kitzur was written and now than from the time of the Beis Hamikdash until the Kitzur was written. In other words in the last 100 years (really the last 50) the world has changed far far more than in the 2000 years before that. It's not possible that Hashem the Dayan HaEmes holds us any where near the same level of responsibility as someone living 100 years ago.

2) Teshuva always helps and once you do Teshuva you bear zero responsibility for any results of your actions. The Gemarah tells us about Rebbe Elazar Ben Dudai who after just doing real Teshuva for living a life far further down the rabbit hole of lust then you have ever been, was called Rebbe a term normally reserved for those with semicha (real semicha). There are many acounts in Chazal about people who not only did avairos but caused emense damage to the world and Klal Yisroel, but after doing Teshuva they were not held responsible for any of it.

3) Thinking about what you may or may not be at fault for doing will absoloutely NOT help you recover. When we think along these lines we think we are doing a mitzvah, but in actuallity it is destroying us! Just keep on davening for your children to return, give them unlimited love and forget about your guilt. Remember: *First Recover Then Repair.* 

Please keep in mind that us in the GYE family feel your pain,sympathize with your suffering we love you, and are davening for you, your wife and your children to come to complete Teshuva, happiness and menuchas hanefesh.
