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I am new to this forum and feel so fortunate to have stumbled upon that ad on voisizneias that led me here.

As a teenager with everything, good family, yeshiva, and decent money, I found myself listening to the radio at night and a certain program introduced me to m\*\*\*\*. I tried it and it was downhill from there. That was 16 years ago or so. In Yeshiva they do not really teach you enough to realize at a young age the pitfall. Later when I learnt some Halacha about these matters (and since I did not know the terminology back then it was hard to discern what was what) I got depressed about this and started trying to stop. Well it was not easy and nothing seemed to work.

As time went on the Internet became available and I got addicted to p\*\*\* as well. Before the internet was high speed and easily accessible I sometimes would buy magazines or videos, so I was addicted before the internet but it was a little harder to feed the addiction back then. Well for about 11 years I struggled and then one day I came across the book the "Light of Ephraim."

I never completed the book but it gave me the backbone to stop m\*\*\*\*. For a while I was able to stay away from P\*\*\* as well. A short while later I got married. B"H from day one of marriage I have loved and adored my wife and I am very attracted to her. Unfortunately I never really dealt with my p\*\*\* addiction and have spent much time the last few years pursuing this trash (unfortunately for my wife I have told her many times I am working late and instead I was wasting time, time that could have been spent with her, time which I can never give her back).

Regarding my previous addiction to m\*\*\*\* in the last 5 years I once had a fall so I think I am managing that well.

Well for the few years I have been married (I also have a couple of kids), I have managed to keep this p\*\*\* addiction a secret from her. Interestingly enough I had told her early in our marriage about my prior m\*\*\*\* problem. Maybe, I was ready to give up m\*\*\*\* and accepted that my past was a part of me that has made me stronger so I was willing to share that with her, but p\*\*\* well that I kind of held onto (not really p\*\*\* I really mean Lust), so I was not ready to tell her. I mean c'mon admitting to it would be a weakness (tongue in cheek).

Well 2 days ago after a night spent feeding my sickness I stumbled across an ad for this site and suddenly my eyes began to open. There was hope and a way to deal with this. I told myself that Hashem sent me here for a reason, and that reason it to get better. I realized that for me I would have to come clean with my wife. I could not go on living a lie. I told myself, I have a good relationship with my wife, telling her this may hurt or destroy that relationship, but I cannot live with this being a secret from her. I need her love, help and support to get through this. I thought to myself that I am putting this in your hands Hashem. I will tell her the truth and you help my wife reach the right decision as to how to respond to this and I accept your judgement. That morning I finally confessed to my wife that I have this addiction. To say the least she was shocked! She was upset as well. We spoke for a while and she began to express her love, support, and belief in me. To say the least it was as if a huge load was taken

off my shoulders. I realize that I may still fall again, but I am committed to accepting that I have a problem and I need to do what I can to fix it.

Every person that is here is a tremendous chizuk to the next person. Without seeing the forums I do not know if I would have found the strength to take these first steps. Today will be my second day clean. It is a baby step and I have a lot to learn, but with all your help I know we will make it.
