Start imperfectly and without much self-respect.

Instead of caring to save your *face*, how about caring to save your *behind*? Your face ain't that pretty, I think.

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An epilogue: I was talking to my friend Laag recently and he commented about how his thread still gets read and he remarked that people probably look based on the name "we all want to be good" thinking they can find a solution here. I thought about it this on Shabbos when I saw a vort from Rav Brevda Shlita quoted in 10 minutes a day to a better marriage (a great book) on the gemara "the one who comes to purify himself is assisted" by Hashem. Says Rav Brevda the gemara "does not say 'the one who *wants* to purify himself ... ' ; rather its says 'the one who *comes* to purify himself...' Everyone would like to be pure but not everyone is willing to put in the effort required. Everyone would like to be assisted from Heaven toward his goal of self-improvement. But only those who take the first agonizingly difficult step will merit Siyata Dish'Maya."
