Dear R76,

I take 3 different medicines everyday to help me with my depression. For the first time in years, I don't want to stay in bed for hours. I understand why you would want to increase your dose, but that is not how thing work.

The chemistry involved with anti-depressants is **very complex**. Basically, the goal is to equalize chemical imbalances in the brain by adding/subtracting chemicals with the drugs. If to much is taken, then there will be to much of that certain chemical and you will get depressed again. So increasing dosage does not always mean increased effects. Plus the side effects are so complicated that I do not even want to think about them.

Just, talk to your doctor about the dosage.
