However, if you keep cutting it and tie it back together again and again, the string becomes very very strong. But it doesn't look as nice.

Leah was the mother of the baalei teshuva. (Reuven, Yehuda, Dovid came from her) She was the the first to be maamid doros. Perhaps not as pretty but stronger. The strength of baalei teshuva.

The ones that keep picking themselves up, keep tying up the knots.

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The tzurim are the avos and the gevohos are the imahos. The father contributes to their child the akshanus. The mother contributes the regesh, the cheshek to be meschazek again and again. To keep getting up after falling. that is gevohos.

medaleg is skipping on one leg. mekapetz is jumping on two legs. the pasuk is saying that for the ones that keep getting up and being mischazek (the gevohos) Hashem kiviyachol, jumps with both legs, a closer connection.

It says by Reuven that he saved Yosef from his bother's hands. The question is that he didn't save him. He was still sold. All he did was have them throw him in a pit (with snakes and scorpions)?

The answer is that at that point Reuven couldn't do any more than that. If you do whatever is in your ability, Hashem counts it as if you did everything. Hashem counts it as if Reuven saved yosef, because he did all he was able to.

All Hashem wants from us is to do whatever we are able to.

It says that someone who does gelila takes the sechar of everyone that had aliyos.

Children are often given gelila. They can't get an aliyah, they can't do hagbaa. He did whatever he can - gelila- then he takes sechar kulam

the question is that we know how much the sechar of some of the mitzvos are, and the gemara even says that for kan tzipur we get rewarded arichus yamim kol shekein mitzohs chamuros? so do we know or not know?

The Tosfos Yom Tov says, the sechar of the mitzvah we know. but the sechar of the effort to do the mitzvah or the zrisus of the mitzvah that we don't know.
