It's hard to know. My biggest fear is that I'm not good enough to succeed on GYE and not bad enough to succeed in SA. I definitely got a lot of hope from that meeting. There were quite a few

other guys whose struggle is very similar to mine, that only got clean through the program. A bunch of guys (even some who are sober for years) mentioned that it took them some time to succeed but they kept coming back and eventually it worked. So, I'm hopeful - stick around and we'll find out!

Did GYE ever work for you?

Yes and no. I got 90 days once. I never felt free from porn and masturbation. I had a lot of 30 - 60 day runs. It was a lot better than pre-gye when I would masturbate 3 - 6 times a day. But in the end I just fell right off the map, as you have seen, uninstalled my filter and said I just can't do it anymore.

Does your wife know you're doing SA?

No. Part of the newcomer's reading from the white book is a caution against telling your wife anything until you start to get sober and even then only under very very wise counsel. For now, it's totally off the table.

Hi, speaking from experience, do not lie about where you are going. Don't make up stories to make it something that it's not.

One of the fundamental parts of SA is being honest, making things up will not only negatively effect your program, but people around you will notice that something is up (I used to tell people that I was going to a chavrusa, it worked for a bit, until people started asking for details. It's very hard to keep fake details straight in your head... A person's wife might notice these mistakes and start suspecting something, and/or feel like there is something wrong, that their husband doesn't trust them ect.)

A few suggestions that have worked for me:

1) I tell people that I have somewhere to go, and leave it at that. I don't tell them what or where, and if they push I brush it off or just tell them that I would appreciate them respecting my privacy (I don't know it this is recommended for someone's spouse... I'm not married, so never had to try)

2) I am going to a private self help workshop/shiur

3) I am going to an appointment/meeting/shiur (if they ask what it's about, see #1 above)

These are just a few suggestions that might help, but ask around and find out what works for other people.

And above all, don't make things up.

Some wives benefit greatly from support groups like S-Anon, others very much don't, but you might want to let her know about the option. Even if she doesn't join a group, it could be very beneficial for you to put her in touch with the wives of others in your group who are willing to speak to her who can offer hope and encouragement and a listening ear to ease the loneliness. Counselling or therapy might also offer her the tools she needs to cope. These are just some suggestions that have helped us.
