I found a very nice system called Funamo. It has filtering, accountability and app blocking all in one. It is probably also one of the most affordable filters as it is \$20 for the life of device which it is own. You can install it for 2 days to try it before purchasing the license.

They have 2 versions of the main app one designed for adults

play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=funamo.accountability and one for children

play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=funamo.funamo. I'm not really sure what the differences are.

For browsing you either use their browser app

play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=funamo.browser (recommended because it is simpler) or

their app to set the proxy settings play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=funamo.proxysettings.

You can find more information as well as use the accountability feature on their website

Funamo.com. A word of caution on the accountability: It links to the websites visited so be careful not to click on the links if they look bad.

Hi,

I have installed Cloudacl WebFilter2012, [Here is the Link: https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.cloudacl.webnanny](https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.cloudacl.webnanny), on some Androids on it seems to work fine. It filters the default Browser, and allows White Listing or Black Listing. However it doesn't work on all devices. As everything you will have to install an App Lock to prevent someone killing the process and uninstalling it. Also you can try Norton Family, [Here is the Link: https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.symantec.familysafety](https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.symantec.familysafety), Which allows remote support and reports, time limits, etc. However I feel that their categories aren't so effective and you need to manually add URL's to black list.

In general please contact a filtering technician who can help you based on your needs and concerns.
