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Tzeil tzeilah and babua d'babua sound like two different things.

Because

a)they are spelled differently

b from the ariza"l (which btw freaked me out a bit) babua d'babua sounds like two separate things not an extension of one thing.

Also if babua d'babua means tzeil tzeilah then we're in deep trouble, because it's one thing if it's two shadows and another if it's just a longer shadow. We can't just tell any suspect to wait here while we get the tape measure.

And two intersecting shadows can be a shadow in a shadow if you look at where it is closer to the person before they split. It's a bit darker at the beginning then gets lighter when they split.

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
