After either method of washing, while the strings are still wet, tighten “em. (Like Gevura said).

Now that we're on the topic, here's a few tips I've found to be very helpful.

Especially after trimming the strings (which are most easily done with ceramic scissors, by the way), coat the ends with either super glue or clear nail polish (the instant dry ones are great), but don't put them in the dryer- this will cause "em to puff up. You can also coat them when they're brand new, to avoid any fraying.

You can do the same with the last knots to keep 'em secure.

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
