Ninety one days ago I was miserable and despondent. I was in a relapse from an attempted (and quite short-lived) sobriety effort. As always, the renewed filth-a-thon was dragging me deeper than ever before, forcing to search out darker and darker fantasies and visions. The lowest point of that particular escapade was arguably from the lower ones in my adult life: the night before, I got up in front of the whole shul and made a public "siyum" on a maseches I haven't finished learning. And it hit me really hard: the realization that I had no integrity left, that I can lie to dozens of people who are my friends, my Rabbis, my sons' teachers; that I can say the wonderful words of Hadran Aloch and know that I am lying....and all because pictures and videos of people doing all kinds of deviant acts take up so much of my life, that I am only faithful to god of orgasm. That is my only true commitment, for which I would lie, deceive, manipulate, throw a fit over, neglect responsibility, assign blame.

By then, I have already instinctively made the first step: I acknowledged my problem for what it is, admitted that I am powerless to stop it, and wrote to my Rebbe begging for help. I may have davened that day for Siyata d'Shmaya, too: because while browsing some Israeli website, I saw a GYE banner.

Ninety one days later, I am, by the Grace of G-d, ninety days clean from intentional watching of pornography and masturbation.

Yes,all of the above and then some...I had some really rotten news about my business so it takes up a chunk of my time.Anyways, here is recent news from the Mottel Universe:I am still, by the Grace of G-d, sexually sober. Had some challenges in recent weeks, but G-d was right there for me, once He "weresought".My son saw me at the computer reading GYE some time ago, and thenhe saw GYE flyers in shul (that I myself had put out) and he put two and twotogether, and being a normal 14-year old brat, he got into a habit of tauntingme. (Agav,that's partially why I'm staying away from GYE).The most recentexample was last week when we were discussing whether he cango to Chanukaconcert in a "fancy" area of our town. The problem with thoseconcerts, that although they are organized by Chabad, they are marketed towardsless-affiliated, and therefore attract all kinds of boys and girls, and womenwho behave and dress in an immodest manner. (Need I elaborate? I think you getthe picture).So even though we've gone to similar events in the past (and Ithink I discussed here our experience at the Chol Hamoed Sukkos concert), I toldmy son that we are not going to this one and that he is not allowed to go alone(read:with friends). After some going back and forth, he tells me: "Well,YOU have a problem with women, so you shouldn't go; but I can, because I willbe just looking at the stage and listening to music".So on Motzei Shabbos,after he allowed himself another similar comment, I took him outside and wespent an hour walking around the block and talking.I told him that since healready suspects something, and that recent changes in our life-style affect himalso, I feel that he deserves an explanation.I didn't mention SA of course, orthe words sexual addiction, but I did tell him that I'm working out certaincharacter defects within a 12-step program,that I realized I cannot tackle onmy own. At the advice of my sponsor, withwhom I discussed this earlier, Ibrought up AA, and pretty much told him that it is AA meetings I go to (my sonwas also suspicious as to where I go at the same time every week).But as aprecursor to this discussion, I told him that I took his desire togo to theconcert seriously, and I've discussed it with some trusted friends,and"let me explain why I feel you

shouldn't go". So I brought up the parsha, and basically told him the following (again, my sponsor gets credit for the general idea as to how to approach it): We find that the same act in this week's parsha is described as a great mitzva and the worst aveiro. What Eishe's Potifar wanted to do with Yosef was exactly the same act that Eir and Oinon should have done with Tomor. So what would have been an awesome mitzva for Tomor's husband(s), would have been the worst aveiro for Yosef. Eir and Oinon chose to do an aveiro instead, and Yosef, by abstaining, chose to do the mitzva. So the doing or refraining from the same action, depending on context, turns it from one extreme to another. G-d gave us a tremendous gift, the power of Ein Sof, to procreate. It is a shame to waste this power, and this is why cheit Eir and Oinon is so grave. On the other hand, controlling your lustful urges is an achievement so great, that Yosef is the only one in the Toir awarded the title Tzaddik. There was more, obviously, in an hour long talk... I think the boy took it well. I told him that should he want to discuss something of this nature with me, he can do it at any time without any shame or fear.

On another note, there is this guy in my shul who is very aggressive in distributing GYE flyers and talking to people about these issues. I believe he is following this forum and may have identified me.

I would like to propose to him, that if he shares in our problem, he should come open on this forum instead of lurking around. I wouldn't mind talking to him in person if he so desires (so PM me to make a date).

However if this person doesn't have a sexual addiction/compulsion I would respectfully request that he stays out of other people's business. He has no idea what we are dealing with here, and should keep his nose out of his fellows' private lives. He may be well-intended but his actions could and would jeopardize someone's recovery if he keeps accosting people publicly. He can chase an addict further away into hiding by blatantly suggesting to people to join GYE etc. So please cease and desist, or at least stay out of the lime light when promoting GYE.
