Thanks for the info! Although I did not go with filternet for a number of reasons, I did come up with an alternate solution.

- 1) I disabled VPN profile that was giving me unrestricted access even over Jnet
- 2) Had my friend install Spectorsoft Pro monitoring software on my PC w/ password protection
- 3) Had him install Spectorsoft e-blaster that provides remote monitoring of my web activity
- 4) Blocked all the questionable sites locally on my PC using e-blaster
