Thinking about those things, I asked myself "what is the "get to" here, and why doesn't Dov say "I had an opportunity to look but didn't"?"

It dawned upon me, based on [a post that I had written about love](#), and how I build how much I love another person by giving of myself to them, and not that love comes by itself, that the same is with loving myself, loving life, and loving Hashem.

Every time that I give away something that will give me pleasure, but it will hurt me, my life, and my relationship with Hashem, I am building my love for those things! Hence, when I remember that, I can easily say that I now "get to" surrender and I now have the "opportunity" to surrender,

which is really saying that I get to grow closer to the things that really matter to me!!
