Then it got easy, and I relaxed my guard. I started slipping veeeery gradually. So gradually, in fact, that I hardly noticed. But I finally decided after falling twice in one day last week that enough is enough. Even if I "only" need a drink once in a while, I cannot life like that, and that inevitably it would get worse if I let it keep going. So I'm back here for round 2. I don't feel AT ALL as if I'm "starting over." I thought of a good analogy today. Some of you may remember "Super Mario Land" on the original game boy. It had 12 levels, which you could beat in a couple hours if you were good enough. When you beat all 12, you could keep playing, starting from level 1, but every level had new monsters and other challenges that were not there before. You could tread the same 12 levels, which all looked the same, and still keep getting stronger because if you didn't, you'd lose.
