This is a great topic and some may say it is long over due. I've wrestled with these issues and have resolved them somewhat in my mind in some limited way. Dov as I understand him speaks about his experience, the way he experiences things and what works for him. He says things as he sees it through it through the perspective of his experience. I have heard Dov say something like "you can't get sober without the 12 steps". Then a second later after someone would object, he would say something like "I never said that, that goes against everything I believe about the 12 steps, if I believed that I couldn't stay sober." So not only didn't he say what you thought he said, it's total opposite of what he believes. Some of what I'm saying here may be what some people are complaining about. I'm not saying it as a complaint. To the extent the fault, if any, lies with Dov I'm sure he works to fix it to the extent he can. However, for me in my experience of what works for me, I have to look at what on my part is contributing to my misunderstanding. I'm not saying you have to do that. You can say screw Dov, if you want. I can't say that because I want what he has and for me to get what he has I have to understand his insights. I recently got into a disagreement with Dov over something he said. He went way above and beyond to try and explain to me what he meant but I wasn't getting it. What I did get is that he wasn't saying what I thought he was saying and he was talking about something totally on a different level than I was hearing. It's like I tell you the car is red and then tell you I'm not saying the car is red and then spend 2 hours explaining to you what I am saying but never explain how I can say the car is red and then say I'm not saying the car is red. Dov often goes way deep and offers insights that are profound. I once spoke to Dov for an expended periods of time because I needed advice of a vital nature. After I spoke to him I spent time digesting what he was saying and then called him back to get more clarity. I was dealing with a difficult issue and I couldn't afford any ambiguity. Turned out that mistook one of the things he said, but I learned what he meant to say because I talked it out with him.

Another thing is that for Dov and from his experience, which i relate to very much, the program of SA is a matter of life and death. It is the ikkur and not the tofel. So if something here is in his experience damaging in that view how could not say that. Is he not obligated to tell someone like himself that something is not good for them based on his experience.

Many people look at sobriety as an end. SA looks at sobriety as a mere beginning. It's a means to an end. If I don't lay a proper foundation I may not have a chance to ever get to that end. Truth is when I say "end" that's probably not very accurate. It's about constant growth as a

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human being. Most people here have, I believe, what is for them a much better method of constant growth and that's Torah and Mitsvos. They feel, rightfully so, that the aveira of shichva zeira livatalah etc is shtering that growth and getting in their way of reaching shlamus. For me that very avodah is detrimental to my recovery. And that isn't kefirah or whatever, it is the fact of my life. My problem was never merely doing an aveira, it was much deeper than that.
