Just four weeks ago I couldn't sit in front of my computer without peeking just for a few minuets at all the filth that the Y"H brought my way.

Just four weeks ago I was the lowest person in the world living the biggest lie. Just four weeks ago I was crying under my desk and I really wanted to change. Indeed in the past I made strong kabbalos I gave myself all kinds of mussar I applied all kinds of advice but I never was able to ever go 2 weeks clean.

I B"H found a lifeline GUE I realized 3 things a. there is a way to recover

B. that I am an addict an addiction will need recovery not that I'm just crazy or SHVACH . C. there is other people in the same boat that are honestly working on changing their lives.

At that point I didn't feel that I deserved to be on the forum let alone on the WOH. So I kept my own journal for two full weeks .It was so hard to change but all the chizuk from reading all the posts on GUE pushed me along.

I still can't believe that I am clean for a month .I am not trying to delude myself to say I arrived I REALLY need all the encouragement to reach my short term goal of 90 days. I am really taking it one day at a time. I am davening for siyatta dishmaya.

I realize that the battle of the Y"H is a full time job. My shemiras ainiyim is on a very good level B"H. I am scared that I will fall so I am really setting small goals.

I came to this realization that I couldn't stop my self until I admitted that I was an addict not that this was just a bad habit this is my addiction. Once I knew I was an addict I was able to accept advice from all the people on the forum because until one doesn't ADMIT he cant be helped because its not for him.

I started to realize that the power of TEFILLA is so great.

I had a wonderful insight in the tefilla we say "VCHOF ES YITZREINU LHSHTABED LACH" we daven that Hashem should force Y"H to be subjugated to HIM. All my life I davened that "my" Y"H should be controlled by "me" .NO NO NO I have learned from the first of the twelve steps we are begging Hashem to force the Y"H to be under HIS control. (I am saying this as a chizuk not trying to delve into deep questions that deal with Emunah).

May all our friends here be the source of inspiration that we all become truly the HEILIGE NESHAMOS WE WERE GIVEN AT BIRTH.

Please give me the chizuk (and mussar too) to reach my goal.

May Hashem bentch each and every one of us.

Says the Heilige Chofetz Chaim, This is called an inside job. Be very careful that you don't mistake real honest HIRHUEI TESHUVAH for an inside job.

He is trying to say I think, that sometimes like what I'm going through now we feel great or in my case I can start crying to hashem with charoto & that makes me feel like wow! I am back! now let me go on to regular life.

But that can be the Y"H's plan too.

He wants you to get over it fast so that you relax and don't take the necessary steps to fight him long term.

So he helps you do teshuva, he helps you cry yourself out so that the next day you feel like you are good to go, but you are not! you still need to put in a lot more effort in order to hold up long term.

the more times he can get us to fall the better chance he has that we will eventually give up & then we are in his sack to stay.

So we need to stay focused for long after are initial teshuve. not being too satisfied that we are now safe & lower are guard.

As much as we have to feel good about the heights we reached we also have to make sure we are not to comfortable with ourselves.

I did ramble a bit to much, but I hope I got it right.

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Efshar Letaken,

You stole the words from my mouth. You said it precisely the way I understand it. And the truth is that I believe that this yesod from *bardichev* is one of the MOST important for people like us. So much of my 15+ years of battle revolved around not realizing this was an "inside job". I went through so many periods of ups and downs as described by *Efshar Letaken*. Every time I did intense teshuvah, I felt "cured" and went back to life as usual. I did not grow in my avodas hateshuvah. I did not grow in my yiras shamayim. I did not grow in my shemira from the Y"H. I did not continue to beseech Hashem for help. I did not continue to address the concept of self

change. I did not grow in kedusha. In my mind, it was all over. The Y"H was gone. Why worry about him? He is dead. But in truth, it was an "inside job". He was still there deep within my heart. He sat there patiently waiting for me to forget the whole episode. And then he would attack. I would be taken off guard, feeling hopeless and powerless, and would just give in.

There was one point in my life (2001) I was going to therapy. One of the reasons I stopped going was because I felt it was futile. Why bother? I no longer desired p\*\*n. I felt so "cured". My shemiras eynayim was great. I felt great. And so after three visits with the therapist, I stopped going. And the Y"H was probably laughing away. He waited six weeks for me to forget. And then he pounced upon me without any warnings; I was goner.

But, B"H, I have learned from mistakes. I have learned the hard way to realize he is still there. As we like to say, "we are always an addict". I do not believe it went away. And I continue to be conscious of my past shortcomings. I do many things in my daily routine so that I will not take my eye off the ball, and that I can continue to grow.

If one cannot understand this yesod, they may have never experienced it. Which is fine. We are different people and all of our struggles are not always the same. But I do think this yesod is something many on this forum have expressed, including myself. But those of us who did experience it are terrified because of it. And so, we fortify ourselves properly, continue to do investigations and ask help from Hashem to activate results.

Once again, thank you *bardichev* for relaying this yesod in such simple terms. It is always good to get a reminder of this. In fact, if you could remind of this yesod once a week, I would have lots to thank you for.
