On a more positive note, I cannot thank enough everyone here who devotes their time to this cause. I know personally that this is the biggest issue I have had in my entire life and my primary taavah. I have never mentioned it to anyone else and it is amazing to be able to write freely here. Everyone who responds here is being osek in meleches shomayim.

Unfortunately, my first clean day will have to start tomorrow as I fell today. That though is a thing of the past for I will not return BEzras Hashem to that stage.

To end on a Torah thought that I heard from the singer Eitan Katz n"y. We say in Tehillim, LeHagid Baboker Chasdecha VEmunascha BaLailos, To declare your chassadim in the morning and emunah at night. What is usually overlooked is that the passuk says VEmunascha, which means and your (Hashem's) emunah, not ours. The message is that during the boker, i.e. times of strength and success when everything is clear like the morning, we praise Hashem for all the help He has given us. When though it is layla, when it is a time of struggle and the divide between right and wrong is not so clear cut, we have to remember Hashem's emunah in us that we will succeed! Through that we are able to succeed.

Another crazy justification I say to myself is - I will just look to see if there is anything triggering in this magazine if there is I will close it right away, my addict side / YH is so clever, and I can only win by having clear defined boundaries and if I break them I have to be honest about it with someone, like Ezra did post it on the forum, as my sickness wants me to keep things that I do shrouded in secrecy and darkness that's where the addiction thrives, but it dies in the light of exposure. It seems clear to me that Mikre Layla should not be considered a fall. Even if the Mikre Layla involved masturbation while partially asleep, I would not view that as "intentional masturbation," as required by rule 8.1; see www.guardureyes.com/GUE/wallofhonor/WOHRules.asp.

What may happen, however, is that the person eventually realizes what he is doing and, due to the intense Tayva, does not stop immediately. Even in that situation, I would hesitate to consider it a fall, being that the masturbation was not started intentionally.

Rav Chaim Kanievsky's ruling can be found in <u>Halichos Chaim</u> in 2 places: volume I section 219, and volume II section 362. In both places it is noted that the <u>Sheilos u'Teshuvos Lehoros</u> <u>Nasan</u> (volume 10 siman 20) disagrees.

The two volumes of <u>Halichos Chaim</u> are questions that were posed to Rav Kanievsky by Rav Yisroel Taplin of Lakewood, NJ, and the answers he received. They were published in 5765 and 5766.

Keep in mind that Rav Kanievsky issued a disclaimer that his responses in these Seforim are not meant to be relied upon as Halacha L'maaseh.
