Zuggy you are right on point. I don't visit other threads, at one time, I felt so high and then read a post that almost made me fall. I was so depressed, I couldn't tell you. It's not that the person was bad or wrote on things that makes you act out. No, it was real, honest, to the heart. Yes, nothing wrong. But it pointed out things, that I couldn't deal with. He surely can deal with it and did deal with it, but I couldn't write even: "Hey, hang in there". I really didn't know what to do, what to say, I felt helpless, feeling it somehow must be this way and there is nothing to do.

But that was then. Slowly I am understanding, that time spent being sober and doing the 90 and beyond, makes a change. I slowly understand, that my addiction will not go away, I am a Beinoni, and I really shouldn't feel depressed about it, it would be really wrong and dangerous.

Anyway, looking back on my feelings when I read that post, I must say, that I feel differently now about it. And slowly I will pop in other threads, gently and tenderly, for my sake and the sake of others.

Before I thought, that everything can be solved by will power. Now, I seem to have changed my viewpoint. I think nothing is solved by will power. We get these feelings and thoughts and it's nothing wrong with them, but a wise person knows where they lead. This is what one must learn. So if you feel that you are attracted to the same gender, I think it's not wrong, but if you are attracted, because you can't cope with every day life and it's a getaway, then it means certain death, eventually you become living dead. That is painful and I think it is the same with the attraction to other women.

It sounds simple, but it's not. Because how do we know the difference between honest attraction and a dishonest one? How can we tell between life and death, when death seems so much sweeter?

I had a dream last night. I dreamt of vampires attacking me and my mother. I had to fight them. So I looked up on the web, what vampires mean.
