the mishna in meseches middos say that in the kodesh hakedashim they had an "atic" that when it was necessary, they would lower workmen in these box type things to do repair and not see the majestic kodesh hakedashim. i dont know about you, but to me when i think about the holiest place on earth, why should hashem allow any type of damage to happen. it should always be in 100% perfect condition! understand the problem?
