I used to be scared of giving up the lust. This was when I was using the lust as the means to fill an empty void deep inside of me. Then when I did much soul searching, I took many "risks" (which were just in reality "trusting in Hashem" no matter what), and changing my life by finding kedusha to fill this void. I filled this void, "no matter what", and now....

When I take that Shabbos walk, and all of the inflated chometz is walking down the street, there IS a voice that says to "have a glance",...BUT, there is a much much louder voice now that clearly reminds me of the bitterness that I will taste if I do have this look. I remember so so very

welll this bitter bitter MAR taste, (for me maybe just as MAR as the morrer is meant to remind us of the bitterness in mitzrayim). That bitter struggle of "wanting lust, and trying not have it". This bitter struggle is so entirely bitter because it is a paradox. How can I try to "not have something", that I am in fact "wanting"?

Be Holy, YES, I know that you can now, this Pesach do what most people don't do, that is to take your emunah and move it from a level of chochmah (in your head), and now use Pesach to "push it down down down into your heart". Emunah in hashem is merely fuel, but when this fuel is stuck in our heads, and we don't put into our heats, (the engine), then this fuel is never put to use.

Use the Kedusha of this Chag, the zman cheruseinu, and take all of your "risks" now, i.e. push the fuel of emunah down into the engine. We need to trust in hashem with our hearts, it is not enough with our "inflated" heads. Your heart felt pleasTOGETHER with the actions 'risks' that are in harmony with these pleas, simply can not go empty handed.

I have posted the following idea on "be holy"'s forum and I think it deserves being repeated here:

Rav Nachman says getting hirhurei zenus is a great zechus. The reason is that it gives a person the opportunity for teshuva and proper tikun for the past aveiros. After a person rectifies his aveiros of pgam habris by refraining in action, Hashem sends him these hirhurim to give him a chance for real teshuvah. He says that so many people get down and depressed when they get these thoughts and feel bad about themselves. But these thoughts are there in order for a person to chase them away and be zoche for teshuva. So just realize that your current challenges are intended for you to attain teshuvah shleima. Knowing this can prevent unnecessary hindrances and should invigorate you for eternal growth.

I am beginning to understand more and more how every little detail of my life is another nisayon and therefore another opportunity for growth. And like ano stated a person always needs to keep his guard up. I have long ago given up lusting, which was easy. But we must still walk with carefulness. And if even the most minute nisayon enter we work to rid ourselves of it. There can be a potential pitfall wherever we go.

May we all continue to be matzliach and continue to grow in kedusha and come to teshuva shleima.
