Ezra, the struggle that you've been going through the past few days reminds me of an allegory. The allegory I am about to relate, I'm sure you can use to find the positive light in your constant and continuous battle with your y"h.

In an arm wrestle a person exerts a fair amount of energy in relation to his opponent. If his opponent is weak, winning doesn't take much. When arm-wrestling someone who is weaker than him, naturally the muscles in his arm don't work as hard - but he can even win in a relaxed state.
